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## 2020 Summary Report of SHS Ordinance Activity in Texas

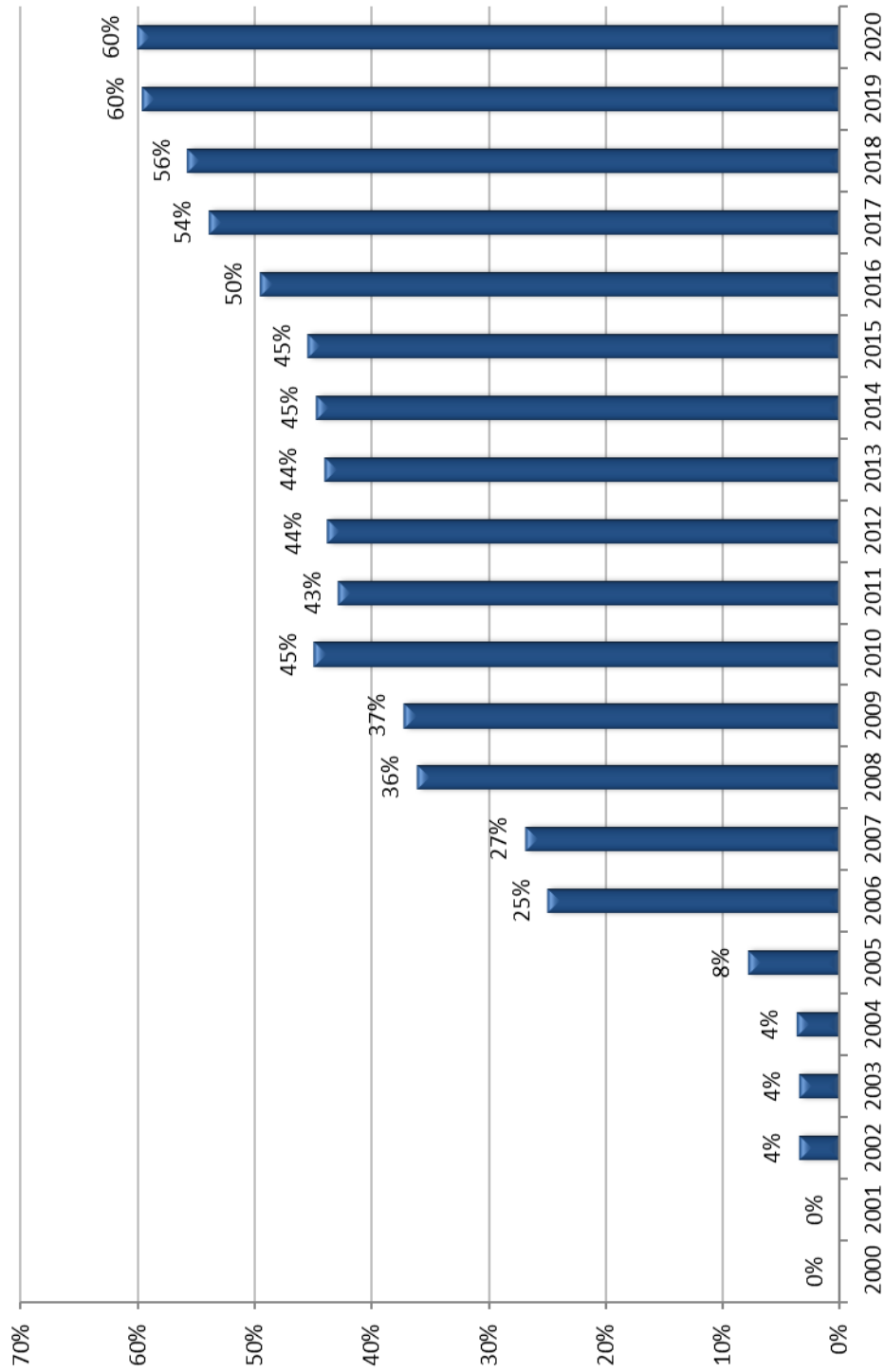

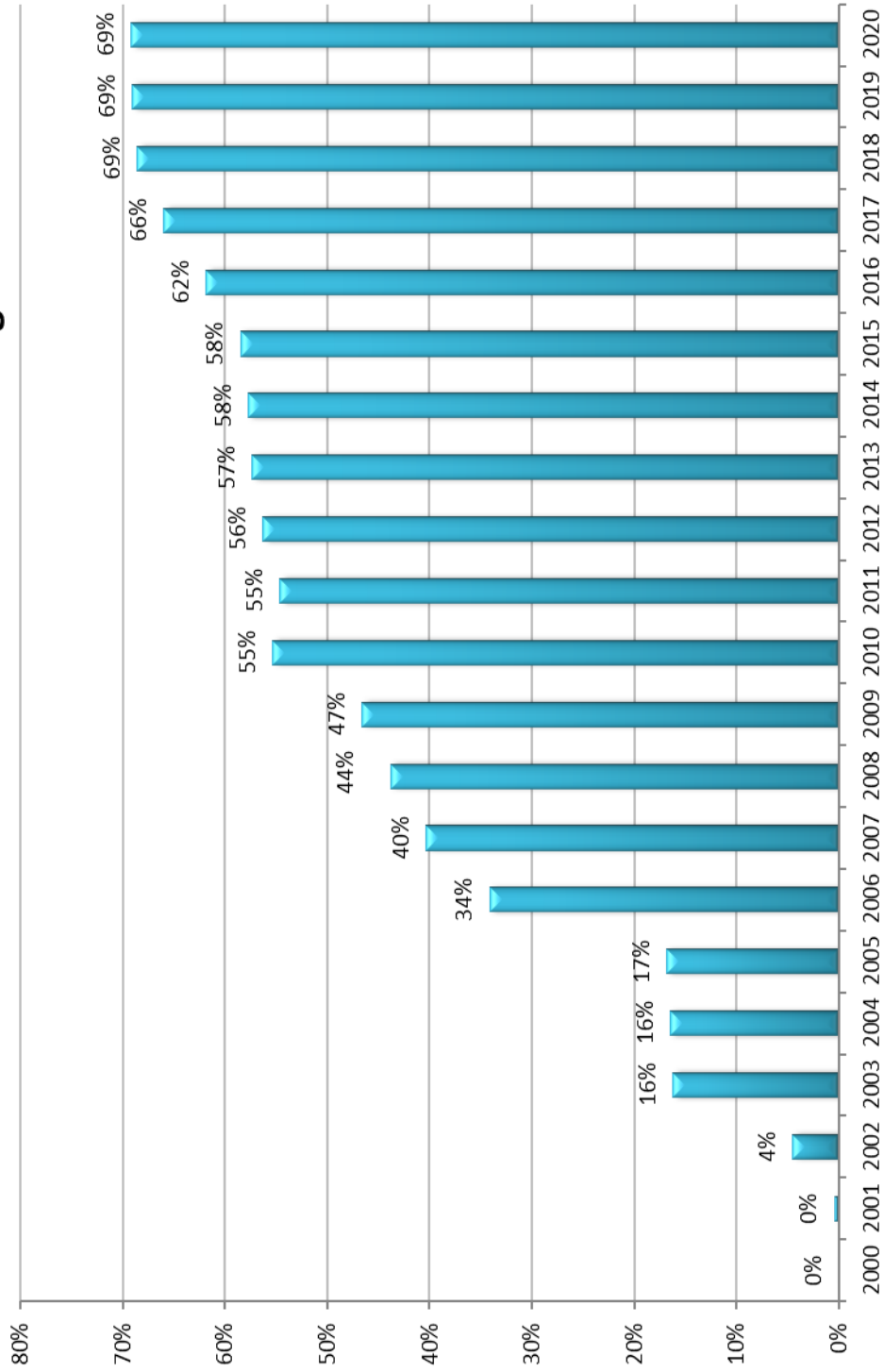
## Percentage of the Texas Municipal Population Protected by 100% Smoke-Free Ordinances in all Five Settings\*

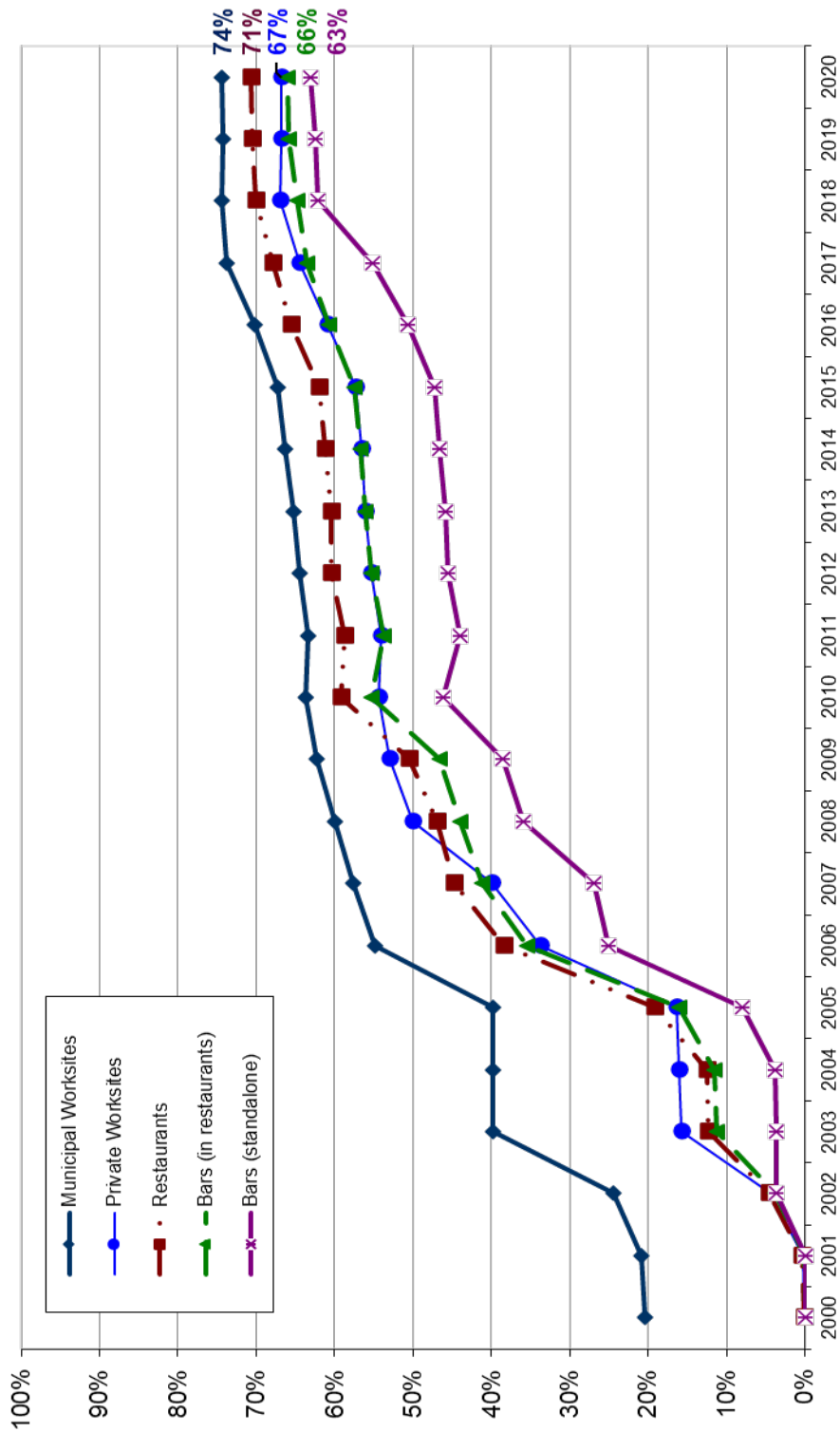
## Percentage of the Texas Municipal Population Protected by 100% Smoke-Free Ordinances in Three or More Settings\*
